## *It's Delightful!*

*"Take delight in the Lord, and God will give you the desires of your heart."*

(Psalm 37:4)

What delights you?

I am freshly back from a three day ("semi"-silent) retreat at a monastery—St. Gregory's Abbey . . . it was *absolutely* delightful. I come back to the news that last Friday's Fish & Chips Dinner was a delight. I keep hearing that the mission, the ministries and the relationships of Pumpkin Patch have been delightful. I trust that we will delight (in the midst of fleeting aggravations) in the Building Renovation project that we have just begun. What delights you?

I wonder: can we make *delight* the mood, the key word, *and* the organizing principle for this Thanksgiving month that lies ahead of us? Can this Psalm become indelibly written into our heads and hearts? While on retreat, I finally gave God a bit more space in my life, and I recognized the delights by which God's Spirit has nudged our life and discipleship at FCC. Might you be willing to give God's Holy Spirit enough space to nudge you to recognize the delights? To open your heart?

Thanksgiving is the perfectly appropriate time for the people of First Congregational Church to recognize how much delight God has brought into our lives. Such thanksgiving should move us to be increasingly generous Stewards of ("delighters in") the gifts of God on Stewardship Sunday, November 11 (We have significant responsibilities ahead as we assume a building loan to complete our Renovations)! I also trust that *many* of you will join me at 4 PM on

Sunday, November 18, at St. Joseph's Catholic Church in Oradell, as I preach at the Annual Interfaith Thanksgiving Service . . . let's show that we are a community that delights in God . . .

*And please use the envelope included in this Congregator to give a sign of your Thanksgiving for the ministries of FCC through our special Thanksgiving Offering—the need is quite significant!*

All of which brings us to the second half of the Psalmist's promise:

*"Take delight in the Lord . . . and God will give you the desires of your heart."*


All our "delighting" would be little more than self-absorption, were it not tied to dreaming of what we long to do in our love of God, of others, and of ourselves. . . and then actively working to make those dreams and desires a reality. So, I also invite you to begin asking—and answering—a question. It is a question which comes from Anthony Robinson in his work with congregations:

*What are our vital few—the vital few things that our Leadership, our congregation, and our staff must do and do well to be faithful and effective? How can the resources God has placed within and among us be channeled for the greatest effect? Where will our trust in God's work and grace lead us to focus?*

What do you desire? Let's talk about it—it could be delightful!

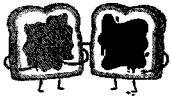
## Childcare 2018-2019

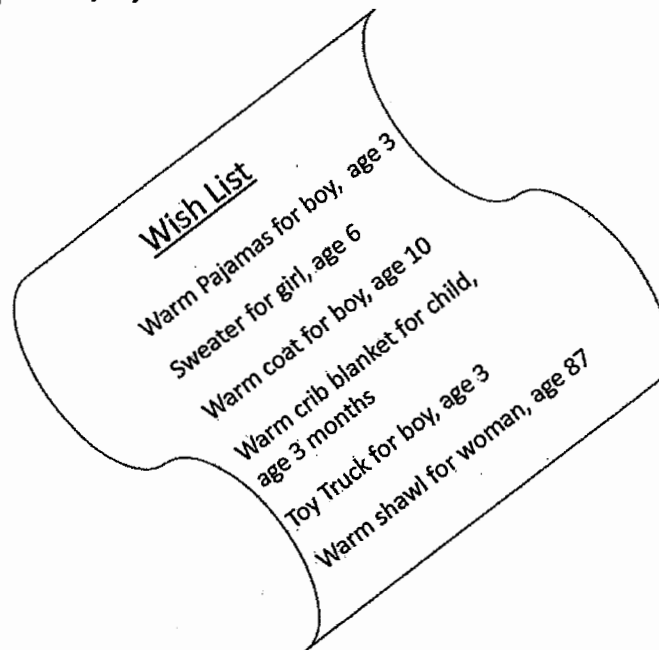
# All Wrapped Up
