

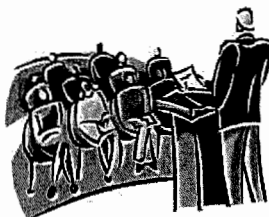

FIRST THINGS

In the Event of . . .

Over time, here and there, I have heard many of you (young as well as old, I may say) mention your considerations of planning in the event of a health crisis . . . and at the event of your death.

Some of us have carefully prepared and signed POLST (Physician's Orders for Life-Sustaining Treatment) or Advance Directives (Living Will and Durable Power of Attorney for Health Care) documents, or other forms that empower others to act on our behalf in the event of debilitating illness that renders us unable to make our own health care decisions.

Some of us have documented our wishes, to aid others in making arrangements at our death: maybe pre-planned arrangements with a funeral home, desires for a funeral or memorial service (from a few scriptures or songs to a fully planned service!), disposition of our body, organ donation, documentation of where important documents or persons may be found . . .

However, some of us do not have an evident or easy "go-to" person who has clear access to our plans. Or, when we *do* enter a crisis, those who *do* stand ready to assist don't know, in the emotion of the moment, where to go to find the essential papers and desires.

For people who are connected to the life of First Congregational Church, we have a way to support you in your preparing for these crisis and transition moments. We are creating a filing system for every family involved in the church. Into those (confidential) files will go any relevant

membership information and accomplishments. But, more importantly, your file is fully available to you, to store copies of any relevant or helpful documents for your security, planning and welfare.

You can let your kin, friend, executor know that you have kept copies of important documents on file at the church. And, at the event of death or other crisis, I (and future pastors) can check your file immediately to see what important considerations you may have given direction on.

So, I hope that this might be helpful for you. If you would like to share any materials, or talk more fully, simply contact our Administrative Assistant Anne, or me.

Lent to Us

"All of life is God's gift." It seems to me that most all of us around FCC live our lives on that assumption. That philosophy is the foundation of a healthy Christian world-view.

If that is our philosophy of life, it has some big implications for how we live our lives:

- If life itself is God's gift, *lent* to us, we ought to use our lives and our bodies well.
- If our relationships and families are God's gift to us, we would do well to nurture the gift, not ignore it.
- If our livelihoods and income and money are God's gift, *lent* to us, it is safe to assume that we should invest that income to help faith unfold (If you want to find out what a person's

values are, just take a look at their check register!).

- If all creation is God's gift, *lent* to us, what in the world are we doing burning up its resources like there is no tomorrow?

The list goes on; you get the point.

The season of Lent begins in a week or two. I know that the word "Lent" means to lengthen, to stretch our faith and lives. But I also wonder whether we might think of it as a time to especially wisely invest what God has LENT us. To use Lent as a season to nurture what God has lent us would mean that we spend some time to foster that relationship with God in prayer, take a little closer look at ourselves in the mirror, and open ourselves up a little more to the cries of others—both the cries of need *and* the cries of joy.

Here are some places and times at First Congregational Church where you can care for God's investment:

❖ **ASH WEDNESDAY WORSHIP**

Wednesday, February 14, 7:00 p.m.

We gather in the Sanctuary for a worship service of song, sermon, and symbol, to remind us of how Lenten discipline and faithfulness can shape our lives. Signing with ashes is offered, as reminder that our lives rest in God's hands. (*Don't miss the 6 pm Soup Supper that precedes worship!*)

❖ **BROWN BAGS AND BIBLES**

Making Sense of the Bible. The world's best-selling, most-read, and most-loved book is also one of the most confusing. Guided by Adam Hamilton's book, *Making Sense of the Bible*, we will find answers to many of the questions asked by Christians and non-Christians alike . . . and address the Bible's place in the hot-button issues that plague the church and

cultural debate. ***Wednesdays, February 21 – April 4, Noon – 1:15.*** Bring your lunch at noon. *Books will be available January 28; sign-ups will be helpful for planning.*

❖ **EVENING PRAYER & COMMUNION**

The Wednesdays of Lent, February 21-March 21, 6:15 – 6:45 p.m.

A simple and quiet service of scripture, Lord's Supper and guided prayer in the *Sanctuary Chancel*. Come and make space for God!

❖ **FIRST'S FILM FESTIVAL**

Gather on three ***Sunday afternoons in Lent*** (2/18, 3/4, 3/18, ***4-6 pm***) for films that can reach all ages and invest us in conversation on Lenten themes. Rumor has it that there may even be popcorn! Find details elsewhere in this Congregator.

❖ **CONFIRMATION**

Youth and their Mentors enter six weeks of more intense preparation for profession of faith on Pentecost Sunday, May 20. The rest of us get to pray for their journey!

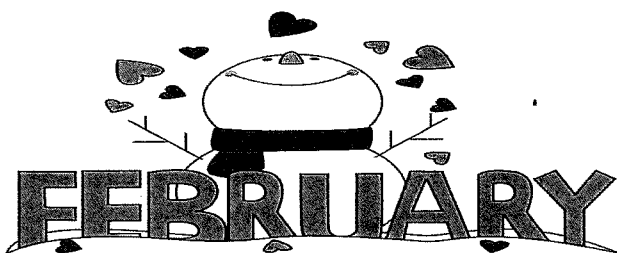

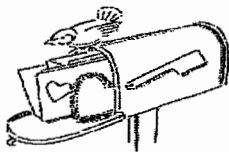

Haitian

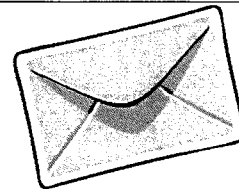

Using funds from the FCC Mission monies, which you donate as part of your regular pledge each year, we are providing a full scholarship (\$470) for the education of a 9th grade girl in Haiti. The scholarship program is run by the Crosby Fund for Haitian Education, established under the auspices of the First Congregational Church of Old Lyme (CT).
