Ash Wednesday Service February 14th, 7PM

The following story has been told for many generations.

Rabbi Simcha Bunam of Pzhysha once said to his students: "Everyone must have two pockets, so that he can reach into the one or the other, according to his needs. In his right pocket are to be the words: 'For my sake was the world created,' and in his left: 'I am but dust and ashes.' "

Depending on our moods and situations in life, we need both pockets to stay grounded. They keep us humble, knowing who we are as a small part of God's creation, while also being infused with a spark of the Divine. One pocket reminds us that life doesn't revolve around us while the other is a reminder that we are uniquely special to God.

This year's Ash Wednesday service will encourage us to reach into both pockets. As a cross is marked on our foreheads, these words will be heard, "You are from the dust and to the dust you shall return. And you are also a beloved child of God, loved unconditionally."

Thus, the Lenten journey toward the cross, along with all its contradictions, begins.

A few lines from a prayer written by Thomas Merton illustrate it well, "My Lord God, I have no idea where I am going. I do not see the road ahead of me. I cannot know for certain where it will end." Merton begins by articulating the unknown, or the darkness inherent on the faith journey. And at the end, he offers consolation, "...I will trust You always. Though I may seem to be lost and in the shadow of death. I will not fear, for You are ever with me, and You will never leave me to face my perils alone."

As we journey together during Lent, may we trust that even though the cross awaits us and there is much uncertainty on the journey, there is always hope in the resurrection. As the beloved community, let us celebrate and embrace it as the end that is also the beginning. Amen.

After Christmas we enter the season of **Epiphany**, the revelation of Jesus Christ to the world and a focus on his





Hello, FCC Family!

It's hard to believe that fresh out from Christmas services and celebrations, we are already preparing to begin Lent!

There is a lot of good music we are looking forward to sharing with you in February, but I wanted to highlight one particularly moving and meaningful anthem the Chancel Choir will be performing: "Follow the Drinking Gourd" in an arrangement by Victor Johnson.

The 'drinking gourd" is another name for the Big Dipper. Asterism and legend has it that it was used by slaves as a reference in keeping them on the right path to freedom. The story goes that a conductor on the Underground Railroad (a network securing secret routes and safe houses to help slaves escape to free states) sang this song to give directions to slaves, thus turning the song into a symbolic map.

The song became popular in the Civil Rights Movement and it remains as a piece of painful history, though showing the unwavering and resilient spirit of slaves. The choir will sing this moving arrangement for you on February 11.


